The family lived in one home for 10 years, then moved and he currently lives in the home his parents built in 1966. His grandfather and his dad loved hunting, so George followed suit starting at eight years old. He also learned to play golf when he was 13 and was an avid golf player for 10 years. He went to college and obtained a degree in Wildlife Management. His degree took him to working for the State of Delaware for 19 years. He ran the Hunter Training Facility, which was an active part of his life. He also worked for Ashland Nature Center for 2-1/2 years. No doubt George likes to talk about nature as he routinely talks about types of birds, flowers, and shrubbery. As my interest developed in the love of Hummingbirds, George has hummingbird feeders in both the front and back of his home though the hummingbirds always went to his house before they graced mine. He follows the hummingbird tracking map and yes some have showed up closer to our homes. We are hoping for an active hummingbird season.



Geoge mentioned he coached baseball, and he owned a 23-foot Grady White fishing boat for about 9 years because he loved to fish.

His life also included being a partner at Frightland for about 12 years, assisting them part time in different capacities. I remember him telling me about the pumpkin patch that was there and how deeply involved Frightland is with the Leukemia Foundation of Delaware. Our club supported the Leukemia

Foundation as our charity for one year.

It is always a pleasure to talk to George. He can be rather funny, and he does a lot for our club. He is the treasurer and always goes beyond just the duties of finance. It is great to honor him.

# Car Articles!



Feature Car - Ginny Corrigan - Mustang GT Convertible, A love story.



I always wanted a Mustang Convertible. They just looked like the coolest car. My Dad taught me to drive a stick shift in an MG convertible when I was 16 and in a full walking cast from extensive knee surgery. You weren't allowed to drive at 16 in New Jersey. But rules never stopped my Dad. He said I could have it if I got good grades my freshman year in college. I learned to party my freshman year and did not get good grades and he had to sell the car to pay my tuition. So, we both reneged on that deal. He borrowed classic cars from his friends for my wedding. It was awesome! Each member of the wedding party was driven to church in a different classic car.

The mustang I own was built in Detroit in 1967, was Wimbledon white and had an automatic transmission. It was shipped to California and transformed into a 4-speed transmission where my Aunt Ginny (yes, I'm her namesake) bought it for her husband for his birthday. My uncle had it painted pearl white (which is so much prettier than the flat Wimbledon). When my uncle died, my cousin used it as a dune buggy. His brother called my father and told him he needed to buy the mustang and fix it up before my cousin destroyed it. My father promptly bought it and had it Fed Exed from California to New Jersey.

He had to blast sand out of everything (absolutely everything). He fixed it up and put a racing clutch in it. I do not know why. All parts are original to the car or the year. But he found he had to replace the clutch every year. I went to car shows with him at least once a year (if not more) to spend time with him and to remind him how much I really always wanted a Mustang. He was VP for sales for the Ford Meter Box Company out of Indiana (so if you see Ford Meter Box Water Works metal circles in side walks that's my Dad's business). His hobby was



you done? You made a fool of everyone...") I finally switched it to an automatic, which according to the Marti report that's what it was originally. She's much better behaved now.

Our favorite meeting place was the First State Mustang and Ford Club Show on Kirkwood Highway. Dad was a member of the South Jersey Mustang Club, and I lived in Newark so we had a good time getting together there every year. He also helped run the

rebuilding classic cars. His first was a '77 mirror black Buick Grand Sport. His second was a burgundy convertible Buick Sky Lark. His third was my convertible pearl white convertible Mustang GT. I named her Sally. His last was a convertible Mustang Fox Body.

As many of you know, I had trouble with the clutch from the beginning (not ALL my fault). It was replaced every season. I renamed her Sadie (as the Beatles sang: "Sexy Sadie, what have

My Mustang is a tribute to the love of cars and the love that my Dad and I shared. We both loved cruising in a nice car and he had the best. He was true a true classic all the way.

Tim read a thank you letter that he received from New Castle County Hodgson Vo-Tech School for the Club donation to a senior student in the auto tech shop meeting the criteria for the excellence award

Tim mentioned Sean's House, our Charity pick for this year. Michelle went and toured the place and spoke with the Director and gave an overview to the E-Board. He was very impressed on the work and support they provide to youths in need. Guest Speaker:

Tom & (Rose) Dilworth, owners of a 1994 Mustang Convertible, spoke about his award winning car. He started out by thanking his wife, Rose, who is very much involved in the whole process and at all the shows right there with him. They started their quest to get a grill medallion in 2005. In order to do this, you must attend at least 10 judged shows and accumulate points, a total of 20pts is required and you will only receive 1 or 2 points at a time for each show attended, it took them 10 years to receive the 1st medallion, and the biggest challenge was traveling, literally driving all over the U.S. There is literally a class for every type of vehicle and encourages everyone to attend a National Show, even if just for the experience, most are 3

days and you learn a lot about your car. He spoke of the unique experiences and meeting and making friends all over, that last. You are competing against yourself and the judging system, not the guy/person next to you, the more modifications, the better, as they like to see owners who are really into making their car special. Expectations of your own and judges nit-picking will make the show experience your own, you will receive the judging sheet, which is helpful in learning what to do and not do, how to clean, etc. Some will receive Gold-Silver-Bronze award with a plaque just for attending. He mentioned there are lots of styles of awards, like the Antique Auto medallion, Platinum Award (given to the highest point car in each class), a Conservator Award, which is white & for participation after receiving the blue Grill Medallion you earn for points, and the big one is the Conservator de Elegance Award and they are continuing to add even more. He mentioned that they want you to continue to come back to shows, year after year, to use your vehicle as an example, especially, if it's received multiple awards. He displayed many of his awards he's received, including a very unique one shaped like a buffalo and had challenge coins inserted. Having a mentor to help you along the way, and for encouragement is also very helpful. He thanked Debby Rosko and the Club for asking him to come and speak. He took a few questions as well.
